## University of Calgary Students' Union Tribunal Process Summary

For more detail please see the General Procedure for the Tribunal.

The Tribunal has the ability to determine if it has jurisdiction over the decision being appealed, if proceeding to a hearing would be an abuse of process, or if the materials fail to support the application. At this point, the Tribunal can choose to either dismiss an application or proceed through Tribunal processes. If the Tribunal decides to dismiss an application, relevant parties will receive notice and the decision will be available to the public.

**Summary Dismissal** 

Any student who had standing in and is dissatisfied with a Review Board decision may appeal that decision to the Tribunal if they believe that the Review Board made a mistake, missed important information, or was obviously unfair in its decision. The SU will timestamp the application and send an initial notice of receipt to the applicant within two business days.

The Tribunal Chair receives applications and determines how to proceed within a reasonable timeframe.

The Tribunal can choose to hold a prehearing conference to clarify issues and procedures and determine if a hearing is actually required.

If it is required, the Tribunal will hold a hearing to determine the merit of an application.

Tribunal decisions are generally based on a review of the Review Board's record of proceedings and are provided in writing with reasons for the decision. Decisions are made available to the public.
